Scroll down to the "America the Beautiful – National Parks and Federal Recreational Lands Pass – **Active Military Pass (Free)**" it's in purple. This pass is **available to U.S. military members and dependents** in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines and Coast Guard to include, Reserve and National Guard members. The pass must be obtained in person at a Federal recreation site by showing a Common Access Card (CAC) or Military ID (Form 1173). There is also a lifetime pass for U.S. citizens or permanent residents with permanent **disabilities**. This is called the "**Access Pass**" and is in blue on the same page.
